MEASURING and HEIGHT CARD INFORMATION

Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; but they must be measured by the **Judge of Record** PRIOR to running in their class and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. However, if a **Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO)** or an **Agility Field Rep** is present; **ALL** dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog measured by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog **before** its first run of the trial or cluster of trials. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running and failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores.

Note: At least one Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO) is expected to be present for each day's Trial. Two are expected on Saturday and Sunday.

Simplified Jump Height Card Process

When filling out the entry form, there is a section at the top of the form for exhibitors to designate whether your dog needs to be officially measured. Please check the box so that the Trial Secretary knows whether to include your dog on the *Dogs To Be Measured List*. It is no longer required that you submit a copy of your dog's jump height card with your entry form or show it during day of show check-in.

DOGS ELIGIBLE TO ENTER

This trial is open to all dogs fifteen (15) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number, or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind or deaf shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate. Puppies under six months of age are prohibited from the trial grounds.

No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance. **Payment must be made in U.S. Funds.**

A maximum of ten (10) entries are allowed in each envelope submitted to the Trial Secretary. Each dog is considered one (1) entry regardless of the number of classes entered. Envelopes with more than ten (10) entries will be returned to the sender.

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry and the Trial Secretary will add up to a \$20 collection fee to the amount of each returned check

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF ENTRY

Acknowledgment of entry acceptance will be emailed upon processing to those listing a legible e-mail address on their entry form. If you would like written confirmation of the status of your entry prior to the issuance of the judging schedule upon closing, please enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope along with your entry.

OBSTACLES AND RING CONDITIONS

Obstacles will meet the specifications for obstacles in the current edition of the Regulations for Agility Trials. All classes will take place indoors on a artificial grass surface. Ring size will be 100' x 90'. Electronic timing will be used. The equipment for this event is being provided by **MAX 200** and will be available for sale at the end of the event. RIBBONS, AWARDS, AND PRIZES

Rosettes will be awarded in each jump height division in each class as follows:

First Place.....	Blue
Second Place.....	Red
Third Place.....	Yellow
Fourth Place.....	White
Qualifying Score.....	Dark Green

A "New Title" rosette will be awarded to all dog and handler teams finishing a title. A MACH rosette and MACH bar will be awarded to all dog and handler teams that attain their MACH. A PACH rosette and PACH bar will be awarded to all dog and handler teams that attain their PACH. All prizes not claimed on the day of the trial will become the property of BOTC.

COURSE WALK-THROUGHS AND WARM-UP INFORMATION

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only. The time and length of the walk-through will be the Judge's discretion.

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, will be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training of the dog.

WAIT LIST

Per Chapter 1, Section 16 Item 1 of the "Regulations for Agility Trials", entries received prior to the Closing Date but in excess of the trial entry limits shall be placed on a Wait List. The Wait List shall be used to fill openings created by entries withdrawing up to 5:00 pm. on **Friday April 11, 2025**. The Wait List shall be limited to 50 entries each day. A full refund will be reimbursed to any entrant whose withdrawn entry is replaced by a wait-listed entry.

MOVE UPS

Dogs may be moved up to a higher class at the request of the owner as a result of qualifying for an agility title. The request must be made in writing by mail or e-mail to the Trial Secretary, no later than **6 p.m. (Eastern Time), Monday April 14, 2025**. Dogs moved up will be at the end of the running order. **MOVEUPS during the weekend of the show (for Saturday or Sunday Trials) will be allowed provided a written Move-Up request is submitted to the Trial Secretary by 6:00 PM the previous day.**

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS

ENTRIES

Illegible or incomplete entries will be returned. All entries must be on official AKC entry forms or photocopies and must include the agreement and rules. No entry shall be made and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance. Owners are responsible for all errors on entry forms and no entry fee will be refunded in the event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date. Type or print carefully to prevent error.

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. BOTC and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The Club reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the BOTC or any official thereof.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations. **The State of Vermont requires a rabies vaccination every three years.**

All dogs must be on leash at all times when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the Club. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee.

Bitches in season are not permitted to compete in Agility Trials. As such, the club will refund entry fees paid less a \$5 processing fee per day for bitches unable to compete for this reason provided the Club is able to fill the slots reserved for that dog from the Waiting List and upon presentation of a veterinarian certificate. This certificate must be presented to the Trial Secretary prior to the start of judging on the first day of the trial.

RINGSIDE

Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging if the dog has a valid temporary or permanent jump height card. Otherwise, they must be available for measuring prior to the start of their class by the judge of record or a VMO or AKC Field Rep if one is available to measure dogs. All dogs not needed for further judging will be excused.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility for providing service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

ADDITIONAL SITE INFORMATION

Indoor Crating space will be available. All dogs crated within the building must be located with designated crating area. Please respect the lines denoting the crating area and keep exits open. The trial site requires a tarp to be placed on the floor underneath your crates. Crates may be left overnight; however, BOTC and The Field House will not be responsible for any lost or damaged items left at the show site.

All Dogs Must Be on Leash both inside and outside the building except when crated, using the warm-up jump or competing in the ring.

The Site Has Parking in good proximity to the building and there is ample outdoor space for walking dogs.

Overnight Parking Space for RVs and Campers is Available Onsite. Space is limited however and advance reservations are required. No electrical, water or sewer hook-ups for motor homes or campers are available. There will be a charge of \$10 per night. See Reservation Form at the end of this Premium.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement. Cleaning supplies and disposal sites will be available at various locations around the show grounds.

Exhibitors who volunteer to work will be entered in BOTC's Worker Raffles and be compensated for their time. An on-line volunteer schedule will be available prior to the Trial Weekend.

The Trial Will Be Held Indoors in a soccer facility. There are a few rules that The Field House insists we respect (so that we can continue to use the facility):

- No hard cleats will be allowed. Indoor soccer shoes and other footwear intended for artificial turf will be allowed.
- No food/eating on the artificial turf. There is a mezzanine with tables and chairs overlooking the trial ring and there is an indoor area on the ground level with tables and chairs.
- The building also houses a health club and rehab facility. Please respect parking spaces that are designated for the patrons of these facilities/businesses.

Please Clean Up After Your Dog at the Field House site so that we can be allowed to continue to use this facility. Handlers who do not clean up after their dogs will be dismissed from the trial.

Directions to The Field House:

From Canada, NH, MA, CT, ME and RI: Take Interstate I-89 to Interstate I-189 (exit 13). Follow I-189 approximately 2 miles to its termination. Turn left onto US Route 7 south (Shelburne Road) and follow south to the Village of Shelburne. At the traffic light in the center of the Village, turn right onto Harbor Road. After crossing the railroad tracks, turn right at the second street onto Athletic Drive.

The Field House is approximately 6.5 miles from exit 13, I-89.

From New York State: Travel north on US Route 7 to Shelburne. Turn left on Harbor Road. After crossing the railroad tracks, turn right at the second street onto Athletic Drive.

RECENT AKC RULE CHANGES

On January 1, 2020, the AKC introduced several new options for handlers when entering and competing with their dog(s) in Agility Trials. These options have evolved a bit since that time as based on experience and feedback from handlers and judges. These changes are described on this page. If you have any questions or need additional information, please contact BOTC's Agility Trial Chair: Tom O'Brien.

Regular and Preferred Entry Options

Effective January 1, 2020, exhibitors may enter a mixture of both Regular and Preferred classes on the same trial day and/or during a trial weekend. Any mixture of Regular and Preferred classes is allowed. Please note:

- If a dog qualifies in Regular Master Standard and Preferred Master JWW (or vice versa) on the same trial day, then **NO** Double Q shall be earned toward either the MACH or PACH title. Earning a Double Q still requires that a Q be earned in both Standard Agility and Jumpers With Weaves in the same day with both Qs earned in either Regular OR Preferred but not both.
- Within the same Regular or Preferred classes, a dog may now be entered in multiple jump heights within the same trial day. For example, the same dog may now be entered in 20-inch Master STD/JWW while also entered in 24C-inch Premier STD/JWW on the same trial day.

A **separate entry form must be submitted** when the same dog is being entered in a mixture of Regular and Preferred and/or different jump heights within the same trial weekend thereby clearly indicating which class(es) and/or jump heights belong together for each trial day of the weekend.

FIX N GO

Fix and Go On (FNG) is now a permanent component of AKC Agility Trials and may be elected by the exhibitor at any time during each individual run.

- FNG allows exhibitors to immediately re-attempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note.
- No registration or advance notice is required.
- Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.
- FNG is elected by the Handler during each run **but may only be done once per run.**

The FNG option was originally intended to be elected by the Handler via a physical signal to the judge. That approach may still be used by the handler. But practical experience with FNG has allowed this option to evolve so that the Judge will signal to the Score Table that FNG has been elected as soon as the judge sees the handler direct their dog to re-attempt a failed obstacle (an obstacle on which that the dog has performed a non-qualifying action). No signal by the handler is required.

Novice and Open Classes – Novice and Open classes allow some faults to occur without the dog/handler team being disqualified; For example: A dog can have up to 2 refusals/runouts in the Novice Standard class and still qualify. So repeating an obstacle might not be considered a FNG in a Novice class unless the handler specifically signals that they wish to elect to do a FNG.

While doing an Fix N Go:

- The handler may re-position the dog and touch the dog to assist the dog in performing the obstacle.
- The handler may return the dog to the start line and lead out again.
- The handler may replace a dropped bar.
- The dog still gets 3 attempts to complete the weave poles. The 2nd or 3rd attempt do not constitute initiating a FNG.

Effect on Maximum Course Time – Electing a FNG For Standard or Jumpers with Weaves Courses will automatically set the maximum course time to either 60 seconds (For Standard Courses) or 45 seconds (For Jumpers with Weaves courses). Quite frequently, this is less time than the dog/handler team would have been otherwise allowed. In any class, the dog/handler team must stop working as soon as the horn sounds and efficiently leave the ring to make way for the next dog/handler team.

Novice and Open Classes – Novice and Open classes allow some faults to occur without the dog/handler team being disqualified; For example: A dog can have up to 2 refusals/runouts in the Novice Standard class and still qualify. So repeating an obstacle might not be considered a FNG in a Novice class unless the handler specifically signals the judge that they wish to elect to do a FNG.

For Exhibition Only (FEO)

For Exhibition Only (FEO) is now an optional component of AKC Agility Trials. FEO is offered at the option of the host club and allows exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO will be of value to new exhibitors or exhibitors that are having difficulty with a specific obstacle and/or ring environment. Please note:

FEO is **now allowed in ALL CLASSES.**

FEO runs are treated as trial entries though FEO runs are non-qualifying.

The exhibitor must enter the class(es) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class.

Dogs may be entered in any eligible jump height for FEO runs. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.

FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form, the Handler will declare the run FEO prior to the start of their run by notifying the Scribe and the Judge as they enter the ring for their run and prior to leading out.

Dogs may be entered in any level of FAST (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master) they are eligible to run in.

Toys: When running FEO:

- Toys are allowed in the ring
- Toys must be non-audible (no squeakers for example)
- Toys may not leave the handler's hand
- Toys that roll freely cannot be used
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring

The Judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time. FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog. Harsh verbal and/or physical corrections or punitive corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.

VOLUNTEER WORKERS ON-LINE SIGN-UP

Volunteers are the heart and soul of an agility trial. We wouldn't get our runs if there were no ring crew, gate stewards, timers, scribes, course builders and others to step forward and build a course or work a class while we run. Please help so the trial days run smoothly.

Volunteers will be treated to snacks and drinks plus be compensated for their time.

Approximately five weeks after the trial entry period opens, an interactive worker signup sheet will be posted on BOTC's website (www.BOTCvt.org). You will be able to see the daily class schedule and be able to sign up to work those classes that best accommodate you and your dog.

The jobs that will be needed for each class include:

- Scribe
- Ring Crew
- Gate Steward
- Timer
- Score Runner
- Leash Runner
- Assistant Scribe
- Course Builders

While previous experience always makes the job more enjoyable, don't let a lack of previous experience dissuade you from volunteering.
